**Hendersonville** – Personnel from the Henderson County Sheriff's Office responded to a breaking and entering call in the area of Old Dana Road on Friday, May 4, 2007. Witnesses in the area saw the suspects trespassing on the property and called the Sheriff's Office. Detectives as well as patrol officers responded to the call within minutes. Once on scene deputies identified themselves and attempted to enter the house. Once inside the house one suspect was questioned. The other suspect jumped off the roof of the house and proceeded to run from deputies towards a thick grove of trees in the rear of the house.

Additional deputies arrived on scene and established a perimeter. Deputy Danny Godman and his K-9 partner "Rex" tracked the suspect through the woods and located him inside the grove of trees in a creek. The suspect was placed into custody and transported to the Henderson County Detention Center.

Seventeen-year-old Jacob Grindrod of 326 Fourth Avenue, Apartment 1, was arrested and charged with breaking and entering and resisting an officer. The other suspect, which was questioned in the house, 23-year-old Indalecio Urbina of 372 King Creek Boulevard was arrested and charged with breaking and entering.

"I am proud of the deputies involved with this breaking and entering case" says Sheriff Rick Davis. "This is a prime example of our officers working together, efficiently and effectively to catch the criminals." "This is also a great example of how working together can resolve these situations in a timely and safe manner."
