

Henderson County Sheriff's Deputies arrested two men on multiple charges stemming from a breaking and entering and larceny that took place on Prince Road Sunday afternoon. When deputies arrived in the area of Prince Road to investigate a report of a suspicious person, they located Felipa Villafranca, of 112 Dolly Case Lane, pushing a Suzuki motorcycle up the road. A Sheriff's Deputy stopped to speak with Villafranca who matched the description given by a caller reporting suspicious activity. Villafranca stated that the motorcycle was his and that it had broken down. He also gave a false name to the officer. At this time, a person claiming to be the owner of the motorcycle arrived on foot and stated that the motorcycle belonged to her husband. Villafranca was arrested as he tried to escape from the deputy. Further investigation by the Sheriff's Office revealed that a residence had been broken into and that Villafranca had an accomplice. The accomplice, Aaron Blake Jones of 20 Dolly Case Lane, was located in the area on Lee Drive where he too claimed that his vehicle was broken down.

Both suspects were found to be in possession of burglary tools, and walkie talkie radios.

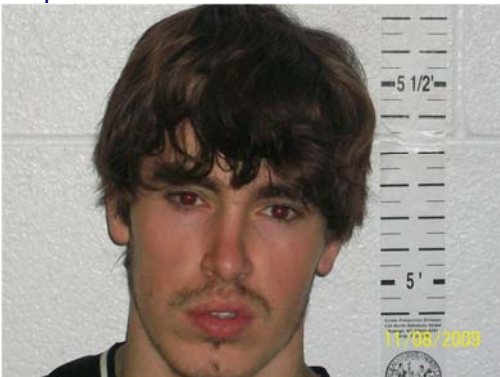
